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Mark Finley is General Manager, Global Energy Markets and US Economics at BP. In addition to analyzing the economics and politics of the world oil market, he has produced market assessments for natural gas and carbon. He leads the annual production of the BP Statistical Review of World Energy (now in its 65th year), and he regularly presents BP's views on global energy markets to external audiences. Mr. Finley has over 30 years of private- and public-sector experience as an energy economist. He joined BP's Economics Team in 2001 and has worked in Washington DC and London.

Mr. Finley has served as Chair of the US Conference of Business Economists as well as the American Petroleum Institute's Committee on Economics and Statistics. He also has served as Vice President of the International Association of Energy Economics and was a 2013 Senior Fellow of the US Association for Energy Economics. He sits on the external advisory board of the University of Michigan Energy Institute and is an elected member of the Council on Foreign Relations. He is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Michigan (Economics), and holds graduate degrees from Northwestern University (Economics)

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
